



# Electricity pricing schedule



Effective 1 April 2025

## NEW DISTRIBUTION PRICES

Aurora Energy's annual pricing adjustments will come into effect on 1 April 2025. The updated prices reflect the significant investment the company has made as part of a five-year safety, reliability and future capacity building programme, which was approved by the Commerce Commission in 2021 after public consultation. These adjustments are inclusive of CPI but also include non-Aurora Energy costs such as Transpower's transmission costs.

On average, prices on our network will increase by 11.2%. However, your individual price change may vary depending on which regional network you are connected to, the impact of the Government's phase-out of low-user fixed charges and any changes in your electricity consumption.

Last year, we began offering retailers the option to apply time of use pricing tariffs for residential customers. If your retailer chooses to implement time of use pricing, you will pay higher rates during peak times and lower rates during off-peak times. This may allow you to better manage your electricity use and therefore bill.

A prudent discount policy applies. If connections in capacity groups 16 kVA and above satisfy the criteria in the Electricity (Low Fixed Charge Tariff Option for Domestic Consumers) Regulations 2004 to be classified as domestic, then Residential pricing applies as the low fixed charge option.

## WHAT MAKES UP YOUR ELECTRICITY BILL?

Aurora Energy takes power from Transpower's national grid and distributes it to your place via power lines and underground cables. Our line charges are just one part of your power bill, and each retailer (who you pay your bill to) packages up the costs differently. Because of this, Aurora Energy cannot guarantee the line charges specified here are the line charges that retailers will bill you. For retail electricity prices, please contact your electricity retailer.

Our line charges recover the direct costs of distributing electricity to you across our network (distribution prices), as well as other indirect costs (pass-through prices) including incentives, rates, regulatory levies, and electricity transmission from Transpower's national grid.
